**BELIEFS-**

Summer 1 - Humanists **do not believe** in a god. They **believe** that people have one life to live - there is no afterlife. As a result they focus on being happy and making the most of their life. They also **believe** they have a duty to support others.

Summer 2 - **The Five Pillars of Islam** are the five key practices that all Muslims are obligated to fulfil throughout their lifetime.

The Qur'an is the word of Allah given to Mohammad.

Muslims should pray 5 times a day facing in the direction of **Mecca**.

The Mosque has no decoration or images to allow Muslims to concentrate on prayer and worship.

**INDIVIDUAL DAILY LIFE-**

Summer 1 - **Christians** - Read the **bible**, pray to God for the world, to thank God for good things, and meet other Christians for worship.

Summer 2 - **Muslims** - Read the **Qu'ran**, pray 5 times a day, wash before praying, learn to read Arabic, and some women wear a hijab.

**INSPIRATIONAL PEOPLE- Islam**

Malala Yousafzai (Activist for female education from Pakistan) became an **international symbol of the fight for girls' education** after she was shot in 2012 for opposing Taliban restrictions on female education in her home country of Pakistan. **PLACES OF WORSHIP**

Church - Christianity – place of worship and prayer.

Mosque - where Muslims go to worship and pray to Allah.

Mecca or Makkah - Where Muslims travel to once in their lifetime as part of the Five Pillars.

**Key Vocabulary and Meanings- Summer 1**

***Humanist**– A person who believes in human values without religion.

Non-religious– Anything not associated with a church or a faith.

Values– standards of behaviour

Moral Rules– Rules for behaviour that show what is right or wrong.

Consequences –The result of our actions or behaviour choices.

Fruits of the Spirit- Love, Joy, Peace, Kindness, Gentleness, Goodness, Patience, Faithfulness, Self-control

Key Vocabulary and Meanings- Summer 2

Islam– the religion of Muslims who worship one God Allah, revealed through the prophet Mohammad

***Muslim**- a follower of the religion of Islam

The Five Pillars of Islam—The five different beliefs that Muslims follow

Pillar 1 — Shahada– The belief that there is one god called Allah and Mohammed is his messenger

Pillar 2— Salah– Muslims must pray 5 times a day

Pillar 3 — Zakat- Muslims give away some of their wages to others

Pillar 4 – Sawm—Muslims fast (go without food) during the festival of Ramadan

Pillar 5— Hajj– Muslims must make a pilgrimage (special journey) to Mecca at least once in their lifetime

Kaaba- a small stone building in the court of the Great Mosque at Mecca
