



YEAR SIX SATS BOOT CAMP



What is it?

Year Six SATs Boot Camp is an online platform that allows children to develop their Maths and English skills in preparation for the SATs exams.

The platform has over 100 online practice test papers which are automatically marked once answers have been submitted. The 'Revise' section contains 50 topic areas with each containing a video tutorial, test style questions linked to that area as well as links to other useful websites.

At Westacre, Year 6 children will complete their maths homework on Year Six SATs Boot Camp

Logging in to SATs Boot Camp

1

Type www.yearsix.co.uk into your browser's address bar (or search for SATs Boot Camp) then click 'LOG IN'.

2

Enter username 'westacre-' followed by your child's first name and the first two letters of their second name e.g. for John Smith, the username would be 'westacre-johnsm'.

Once logged in, children will have three options:

Revise

Practice SATs tests

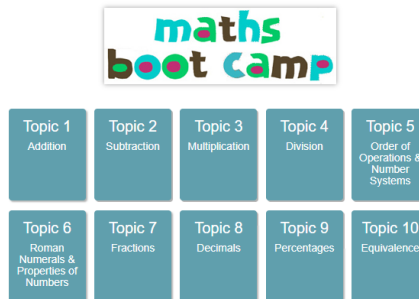
Test scores

The 'Revise' section contains individual topics that children can practice. Children can also apply their skills in the 'Practice SATs tests' page and then check their progress in the 'Test scores' section.

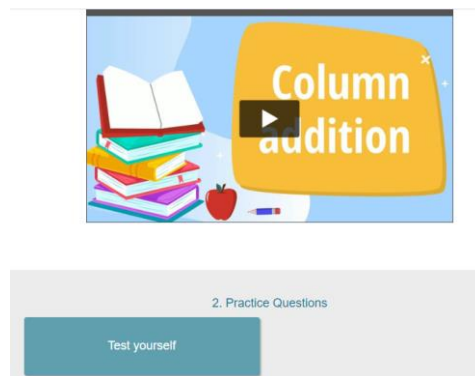
Homework

Homework each week will be set using both the 'Revise' section and the 'Practice SATs test' section.

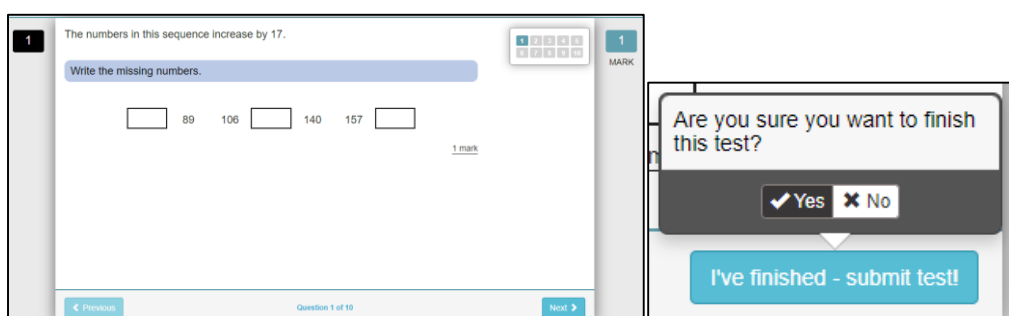
If for example, children have been set to complete 'Topic 1 - Addition' they will click this button on the 'Revise' page.



We recommend children watch the tutorial at the top of the page before clicking the 'Test yourself' button below.



Children are to do their workings as normal on paper or in their jotters but then input the answer into the appropriate box on the screen. Afterwards, they will click the 'Next' button to proceed to the next question. Please make sure that on the last question, the homework is submitted.



After submitting their test, children can check their scores for each question. For any that are incorrect, they can check what the correct answer is by turning on the 'Correct Answer' button to the left of the question.
