



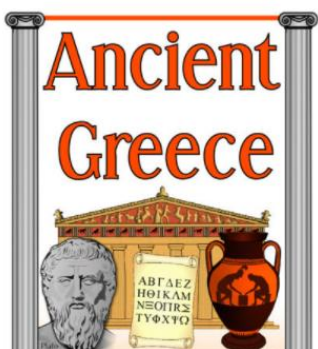
CC Topic Homework – Ancient Greeks

Task	Explanation
Computing / STEM Create a presentation about Greek technology inventions.	- The presentation could be created on PowerPoint, but you could also present it on paper. - Explain at least 3 different Greek technology inventions. - You could 'voice over' the presentation, or record yourself presenting it.
Science Research the story of Eureka! and Archimedes. Discuss how this relates to modern life. How could you prove it now?	- Summarise the story. - Explain why the story is so important to modern life. - How could you prove the 'Archimedes Principle' now? - You could test the principle and take photos of you doing so. Music Make a Greek musical instrument, inspired by the Lyre	- Research what a Lyre is. - Sketch your 'new' instrument, inspired by the Lyre. Ensure it is labelled with the materials that it would be made of out. - Write an explanation on how it would be played. - Make a model of the instrument - you can be creative with what you use. From cardboard boxes to wood, the choice is yours! Click HERE to find out more about a Lyre.
Geography Create a map of the area of Greece and the surrounding areas, including at least 5 cities and 1 landmark.	- Use an atlas or Google Maps to sketch out a map of Greece. - Include the surrounding countries - Label at least 5 cities - Label at least 1 landmark - Could you even make it 3D?
R&W Create a fact file about one of the Greek Gods or Goddesses.	- Choose a Greek God or Goddess. - Research facts about it. - Create a Fact File that you could give to someone in Year 5, to explain everything they would need to know about the God. - How you present your Fact File is up to you!
Etymology (English) Research 10 English words with Greek origins. Explain the 'stories' behind them.	- Research 10 English words that have Greek origins. - Explain the stories behind them. - This could be presenting in any way you like! PowerPoint? Video? Poster?
PE Invent a game for the Olympics.	- Invent a new sport for the Olympics! - You need to write the equipment, an overview of the sport and a list of rules. - You could even get your friends or family to have a go at the new invented sport. What did they think of it?



Art Draw or create a Grecian mask to represent your chosen god or goddess.	• Research Grecian masks for inspiration. • Thinking about a god or goddess in particular, create a mask to represent them. • The mask can be drawn, or made to size, out of any materials. • Write a small explanation about why you designed the mask as you did and how it represents your chosen god. DT Make a meal inspired by Greek cuisine.	• Make a meal inspired by Greek cuisine. • Write out the recipe to go with the meal. • You could even, with the help of someone at home, make this meal for your family to enjoy. • Could your family give you a star rating on your meal? What did they like? What did they dislike? • Take photos of the finished meal and you making it.
History Produce a timeline of the Ancient Greek period.	• Research at least 5 key events during the Ancient Greek period. • Produce a timeline to show these. • Think 'outside the box' when creating your timeline. Could you use drawings? Could you use a long piece of paper rolled up? Could you create a mini movie?
